Both composers have some connection with Vienna: the extravagantly named Maria Luigi Carlo Zenobio Salvatore Cherubini, after a Europe spanning career, became Napoléon's Director of Music in that city, and the more modestly named Johann Gänsbacher directed the music of St Stephen's Cathedral. This concert gives you the chance to hear two works a step to the side of the mainstream repertoire.
